2. **It is feasible to earn a negative score on this Final Exam.**
3. Open an MS Word file. Start|Programs|MS Word.
 - 3a. Name it with "your-last-name final", and save it in the O'Hara folder on the mtemp drive. Use menu item File|Save As ... , then select the mtemp drive from the Save In: dropdown menu at top left, next add "your-last-name final.doc" in the file name window at bottom right, and click the "Save" button.
 - 3b. Before adding any text to the body of this new file, highlight the first line, then select menu item Format|Font, select the tab named Font, then select Tahoma Regular 12, click the button "Default ...", and finally click the button "Yes".
 - 3c. Set your line spacing as double spacing. Use menu item Format|Paragraph ... then select the "Indents and Spacing" tab, next select "double" from the drop down menu of "Line Spacing:", then click the "OK" button.
 - 3d. Set your margins by using the File|Page Setup ... menu item and selecting the "Margins" tab, then set the margins at 1 inch or more. Typically, you will find the MS Word default is set at 1.25" right and left as well as 1" top and bottom. That is fine.
There is a time limit, not a page limit, to this exam.

- 3e. Create a header by using the menu item View|Header and Footer, then in the header add type your name at the left margin and at the right margin use the menu item Insert|AutoText|Header/Footer|Page X of Y.
4. You may write until 8:30 PM.
Be sure to use the spellchecker prior to submitting your exam.
Use the menu item Tools|Spelling and Grammar ... or the menu bar ABC icon.
You shall send your Print command no later than 8:30 PM.
The print command is at menu item File|Print

5. **Failure to comply with all of Instruction 3 will result in an automatic loss of 10% of the Final Exam's 100%.**
6. There are multiple versions of the exam.
Randomly,
each student is assigned one version from which to author an essay.
During the initial 15 minutes of the exam time,
a student may return that version of the exam in exchange for another version,
and may do so a second time during that same 15 minutes.
Upon receipt of a version,
the student shall sign that document with the student's printed name.
7. The student's essay
may be on any topic of the student's choosing.
8. The student's essay
shall demonstrate the student's adroit use of the "ten" vocabulary words.
No essay shall contain a definition of any vocabulary "word".
Every definition of a vocabulary "word" shall
earn an automatic minus 10% of the Final Exam's 100%.
Recall Instruction 2.
9. Each "word" in the "ten word" list is worth 10% of the Final Exam's 100%.
Thus, "due process (=2)" is worth 20% of the Final Exam.
 - 9a. When a "word" has multiple items and those items divide equally into the available percent of the Final Exam, then each item has that equal weight.
Thus,
the five items within "due process" each are worth 4% of the Final Exam.
 - 9b. When a "word" has multiple items and those items do not divide equally into the available percent, then each item will be worth at least as much as the number of items can be equally divided, but the remainder will be distributed according to importance of the item.
Thus,
of the three items within "parody (=1), two will be worth 4% and one will be worth 3% of the Final Exam.

- 9c. The items with the least weight will be listed last.
Note Instruction 12.
- 9d. *The worth of an item on the Final Exam may range between 10% and 3% of Final Exam.*
Items worth more are expected to be used proportionally to the worth.
However, use is not measured solely by frequency.
Proportional use is measured by adroit use of the item.
10. Within the essay, each use of an item within the "ten words" shall be **bolded**.
Each use of an item that is **not bolded** will **earn minus 1%**.
Recall Instruction 2.
- 10a. Using the menu item Edit|Find ... you can search your document for every occurrence of a word or a phrase.
- 10b. To bold a word or phrase, first highlight it and then either use the menu bar bold "B" or use the menu item Format|Font.
11. A student may not use a definition in the essay.
However, the full meaning of each item is expected to be unambiguously activated by the contextual use of the "word" item. For example, a -10% will be earned by a sentence that resembles "Procedural due process requires notice and hearing, with both proportional to the interest involved." In contrast, a sentence that resembles "The oral phone message, giving notice of the disciplinary hearing in ten minutes for her illegal drug use, that was left with the professional kite flyer's roommate was notice that was less than commercially reasonable." would earn positive credit.
12. Each version of the Final Exam will list the "ten words" in two manners.
First, at the top of the page a truncated list will identify the "words" and their worth: for example, due process (=2), Rule of 72 (=1), limits (=1), Police Power (=1), injunction (=1), risk (=4). **Second**, below that truncated list will be a full list of all of the "words" and their component items. For example,
due process (=2): due process (commercial), due process (re procedure), due process (re substantive), Due Process Clause (re Fifth Amendment), Due Process Clause (re Fourteenth Amendment);
Rule of 72 (=1): Rule of 72;
limits (=1): limits (dynamic), limits (static);
Police Power (=1): Police Power;
injunction (=1): injunction;
risk (=4): risk (assumption of the), risk (insurance), risk (management of), risk (subjective perception of), risk allocation (social), risk aversion, risk can not be zero, risk exposure, risk neutral, risk preference, risk premium, risk seeking.
13. Every Final Exam shall contain:
[A] due process (=2);
[B] at least one "word" from the "cryptic questions" distributed for the *Natural Capitalism* textbook and posted to BlackBoard; and
[C] at least one "word" from economics.

14. **The Instructions distributed with each version of the Final Exam shall incorporate these Instructions by reference rather than repeat these Instructions on that document.**
