

This game has two sheets: the individual's and the team's.

FIRST, the obverse of the INDIVIDUAL'S sheet is a page from the Vocabulary List upon which the individual circles *three known and two unknown words*. On the reverse of the individual's sheet the individual shall PRINT the selected words; PRINT the individual's *definition of all five* chosen words; circling K or U to indicate knowledge; as well as PRINT the individual's last name. The instructor will evaluate¹ those choices (i.e., chosen word is easy versus hard; definition's quality is good versus feeble versus wrong).

The individual's completed sheet (i.e., circles, circles, words, definitions, and signature) is a mere ticket to joining the team. The first individual to successfully present an individual's completed sheet is the team leader and is responsible for completing the team's total point sheet and submitting the team's total point sheet (stapled to all of its individuals' sheets).

There are five teams. Teams are built as each individual earns a ticket, but membership existed at the start of the game. The **total time** for the Vocabulary List game is the **shorter of 25 minutes and** the finishing of the **third-to-last team**. The teams that do not finish earn zero total team points.

SECOND, drawing solely from the words completed by the individuals that make up the team, on the TEAM'S total points sheet the team leader shall PRINT the five words that the team believes will yield the team its highest score: but, those five must include a minimum of two HARD words. The team leaders lists the words alphabetically, marks the difficulty, but lists the HARD words before the EASY words. The team leader also shall PRINT the team's definitions for each of its five words. The team leader also shall PRINT the individual's last names.

The team's words and definitions yield the total team points. The **total team points** score is calculated as follows, for each of the team's five words.

	GOOD ²	FEEBLE	WRONG
HARD	+2	+1	+0
EASY	+1	+0	-1

The individual's prior choices constrain the team's subsequent choices. The total team points score *can be* higher if the individuals select different words and select HARD words. For example, a team of four individuals that provided the team the opportunity to chose five HARD words can earn a *maximum* total score of +10; whereas a poorly performing team of risk adverse individuals might earn the *minimum* score of -3 (recall: minimum of two HARD).³

Each member of the team scoring the **most total points earns plus one extra credit** course point. Each member of the team scoring the *second most total points earns plus one-half extra credit* course point. However, regardless of team placement, all teams earning zero or fewer total team points earn zero extra credit points.

¹ **Reminder:** Any form of academic dishonesty may earn a course grade of "F". This game is closed book, closed notes, closed web, closed any source of any information other than open team discussion.

² A "good" definition by an individual is not necessarily a "good" definition by a team.

³ To earn +10 requires the four individuals to have collectively chosen five different HARD words.

Otherwise, the team can not have the option of seeking the maximum team points. It is feasible the team's individuals might have provided the team with zero HARD words and thus the team must earn zero points on the required two HARD words (i.e., its maximum team points are +3). Also note, if the individuals' collective choices provide the team with the two and only two HARD words, then the team must choose those two HARD words.
